The History of Nivada Grenchen

Nivada is a Swiss watch company, founded in 1879 in Grenchen, It grew steadily after World War II and launched some iconic lines of models, viz. Depthmaster, Chronomaster, Depthomatic & Antarctic, until the company succumbed to the quartz crisis. The firm remained under the control of the Schneider family until its 50th anniversary in 1976. From the earliest days, the company focused on instrument watches that went beyond the simple indication of the time, being among the first to offer waterproof automatic movements (Aquamatic, or to feature

chronograph with additional functions. But Nivada was disallowed from using its name due to its phonetic similarity with Movado. Hence, they were labeled "Nivada Grenchen." During the mid 50s and 60s. Nivada had Authorized Dealers in 84 countries spanning over all habitable continents. Croton has been the authorized distributor of Nivada in the United States since 1940. Many watches were sold under the name of "Croton Nivada." "Croton Nivada Grenchen," or "Croton." The brand had a brief stint with the Kim Suk Keun Watch Company of South Korea from 1985





The Revival of Nivada Grenchen

In 2018, a French entrepreneur, Guillaume Laidet met Rémi Chabrat. Founder & CEO of Montrichard, who also works with the current holder of the rights to Nivada, the company Grupo Industrial Omega, S.A. de C.V. which is based in Mexico. The two men devised the idea to relaunch Nivada Grenchen globally and revive the brand to its past glory. Grupo Industrial Omega, S.A. de C.V welcomed the project with open arms. The parties agreed, and sleeping beauty was awakened. The primary purpose of the new company was to relaunch it's previous iconic models. Thus began the task to bring the Antarctic, Chronomaster & Depthmaster back to its past glory. The vintage reissues are kept as faithful to the original as possible and presented to the buyers at competitive rates. The company received a great deal of positive feedback from watch enthusiasts and fans when their first design was shared on social media. "We will only focus on vintage re-editions," said Laidet, a highly experienced

entrepreneur in his field who had worked with brands like Zenith and Jaeger-LeCoultre. He mentioned, "There is everything we need in the past collections of Nivada Grenchen. We have demands for the Depthmaster, Datomaster, Antarctic diver, and Chronoking." Sky was the limit. And today, Nivada is going great guns, periodically launching various reissues. Orders are taken online, bypassing the distributor's commission and giving it its benefit to the buyer. To sum it up, the company has mastered the art in its niche market and gathered a faithful and growing fan following, mainly via social media.

A Historic Synopsis & Preface

The History of Compensamatic

In 1938, the British notified the Swiss watch industry that they were buying wristwatches and that no testing was necessary. They had a simple fact sheet. The company's requirements were simple, such as 15 jewels, waterproof, and a few other simple criteria. Croton wanted to participate. Croton decided to build a completely sealed single-case system wristwatch as a candidate for military use. The challenge that Croton faced was the Wyler company. Wyler held patents on the best waterproof case design. Their Wyler singlecased, crystal-sealed, two-part stem case system was the best in the world then. Arguably, some say it was even better than Rolex. Their case system would dominate the world for quite a while. Croton went to work devising and designing a casing system that would compete with Wyler and most of the steel screwback designs. Croton chose a single steel case in which the movement was fit. They then sealed the movement by placing a rubber seal on the case's top ledges and a "top hat" crystal over the seal. They then incorporated the Wyler two-piece stem system. They built a steel bezel [with lugs] that fit over the crystal and the case to keep it unique. They then drilled and threaded each lug, utilizing headless screws to push the case up and into the bezel. The pressure would compress the seal between the case and the bezel. Lastly, they then added a "compensating" movement and called their technology "Compensamatic." "

Compensamatic" was not a thing, an act, a system, or even a technology. It was a word: a trademark that represented the "technology" that was "Croton"/"Nivada". Croton never succeeded in selling military watches compared to Bulova, Phenix, Omega, and others. But the name "Croton"+"Nivada" would soon dominate a new market. The scientific and diving world. Nivada and Croton would be as one, and Compensamatic would be trademarked in the USA in 1956 by Nivada. Compensamatic would become known worldwide as Nivada and Croton built some of the most advanced watches in the world. Chronographs, professional dive watches, skin divers, and the famous Antarctic model watches helped make the word Compensamatic famous.

Product Range of Nivada

The product range of Nivada was extensive and included small ladies' watches, dressers, professional divers, skin divers, chronographs, and chronometers. Nivada quickly made a name for itself as a designer of attractive watches and cases. It can also be described as quite innovative in other respects.

In the 1930s, Nivada was one of the first companies to produce automatic watches. In the 50s, Nivada began to develop into a manufacturer of robust exceptional watches made for scientific expeditions - their Antarctic range. Nivada adapted to making diving watches in the mid-1960s by introducing the "Depthomatic" and "Depthomaster". In 1963, Nivada launched their legendary Chronomaster series. All these will be covered in a vintage ad pictorial chapter.

In 1953, a lawsuit broke out in the United States after Croton was refused importation of watches marked "Nivada Grenchen" by American customs:

Footnote 2 of the judgment quotes the 1939 agreement between Croton's predecessor Horowitz and Movado:

"The 1939 agreement was made in settlement of an action brought by Movado Watch Agency, Inc., against William C. Horowitz for infringement of its trademark "Movado." Horowitz was the Croton Watch Company's predecessor in business. Paragraph 1 of the agreement reads as follows:

"1. The Second Party [Horowitz] will not, except as expressly agreed, manufacture, purchase, or import for sale nor sell nor offer any watches, watch cases or watch movements bearing the name Nivada, standing alone. The Second Party, however, may, without objection from the First Party [Movado Watch Agency, Inc.] use the said name Nivada in combination with or followed by the word Grenchen or the word Granges (the name Granges being the French form of the name of the town in Switzerland in which Nivada SA has its factory), and on watch movements the initials SA' may be inserted between the word Nivada and the word Grenchen or Granges, to comply with United States Customs requirements." (Names of parties supplied)."



History of the Nivada Grenchen Depthmaster

Nivada Grenchen launched the Depthmaster in 1965, a dynamic dive watch that could withstand the pressure of 100 ATM (1,000 meters). It was not a small feat, considering most dive watches of that era offered a water resistance of just 150–200 meters. Instead, this was a record for the industry until Rolex introduced its Sea-Dweller. Its 38mm cushion case with a rotating bezel case, made from compressed Swedish steel, was created by an independent manufacturer and supplier to many watch companies across the globe. Such as Jacquet Droz, LeCoultre, Sandoz, Nivada, Austin, Jungfrau and even Orient of Japan added their own unique dials to this popular case. It was powered by ETA caliber 2472/2461.

Although the first watch released in this case Sandoz's stand-alone model in 1963, Nivada capitalized it to the fullest and introduced the Depthmaster in 1965 with a flare. They offered a wide range of dials, hands and indices iterations. The most iconic being the 'Pacman'. Nicknamed by it's fans later, since its art deco numerals 6 θ 9 bore solid resemblance to the character of the video game. Depthmasters were also released in various iterations, but in small quantities, which are hard to find.

In January 1967, Nivada advertised the watch known and named "Depthmaster" (Ref. 650) in the Schweizerische Uhrmacher-Zeitung for the first time, which mentioned, "it can withstand a pressure of up to 100 atmospheres. It was specially created for deep-sea divers and combat swimmers working in difficult conditions. The solid Swedish steel case, totally waterproof, is fitted with 3.4 mm thick chemical-resistant glass and can even withstand the weight of a truck". Ever since then, it has basked in its glory as one of the avant grade diver's watch, waterproof up to 1000m until it succumbed to the quartz crisis.

Probably the world's most waterproof watch, with a guarantee down to 3,300 feet, which is 100 times atmospheric pressure. The case is entirely made of Swedish steel, including the lugs which form part of the same steel block. The glass is the strongest ever used on a watch, and cannot break. The rotating time elapsed bezel has a permanent lubricating system, with indelible markers. The numerals are of special high intensity luminous material (non-radio-active), and the dial is in low reflection black. The jewelled lever movement is of the highest quality, with super shock protection. The watch is selfwinding and incorporates an automatic calendar. Complete with a heavy duty diving strap this is one of the strongest watches ever made.

Model No. 650

Most vintage Depthmasters (besides the offbeat models) were powered by an automatic ETA 2472 movement fitted in a 38mm cushion-shaped case with a stainless steel rotating bezel. Most sported a sword ϑ lolly-pop minute and hour hands, respectively ϑ a stick seconds hand, whereas a few had different iterations. In its day, it was claimed to be 3000ft waterproof, which is far more water-resistant than most modern dive watches today.

The unique Art Deco font of the numerals (6 and 9) was why this model was fondly nicknamed "Pacman". Given that it started production in the 1960s, it's clear that the name was applied later by collectors, since the iconic Pac-Man video game debuted in the 80s.

Why should the Nivada Depthmaster not be nicknamed as 'baby Panerai'

The Nivada Grenchen Depthmaster has its own character with a rotating diver's bezel, whereas all Panerai watches have fixed bezels. The various iterations of dial, hands, and indices offered on the Depthmaster, especially their legendary 'Pacman' dial, were far from the ones used on Panerai. Depthmaster had applied lumes on their markers, whereas Panerai had 'sandwiched' lumes. Even the aesthetics of the case are different. Panerai came out with numerous iterations of cases compared to the contours of the Depthmaster case, which has remained the same (besides a few iterations manufactured in very low quantities). Hence, a Depthmaster has a strong character of its own and doesn't need to be associated with the overall aesthetics of any other brand.

When collectors think about dive watches, one of the first things that pop up in their mind is a rotating bezel.

Some more collectible and August examples include the Universal Genève Polerouter Sub, Longines $Compressor, Vulcain\ Diving\ Alarm,\ IWC\ Aquatimer,\ and\ the\ Jaeger-LeCoultre\ Polaris.$

Benrus, Bulova and Pronto and various other brands used identical cases, but were they ever nicknamed after the giants? No! Even though the same manufacturer made the cases. Then why should we call the Depthmaster a Baby Panerai, when, besides various other differences mentioned above, they did not even use the same case!

The Revival of Nivada Grenchen Depthmaster in February 2021

The first pre-orders of the Depthmaster were taken on February 17th 2021 and delivered in July.

The re-issue of the Depthmaster 1000 is similar to its vintage counterpart. It maintains its predecessor's 47 mm lug-to-lug and 13 mm thick measurements. Even the case buffing combination of brushed and polished surfaces is similar to the original and has thick lugs and a wide raised elapsed time bezel. The new version features a screw-down crown cambered sapphire crystal, and a helium escape valve at 9 o'clock (for saturation diving).

The vintage versions were powered by an ETA caliber 2472/2461 movement. In contrast, the new Depthmasters are equipped with a self-winding and hacking Sellita SW200 no-date (without ghost position), having a power reserve of 38 hours, and hum at 28,800 vibrations per hour (or 4Hz). Currently, the movements used in the Depthmaster is Soprod p024.




Depthmaster 'Jellyfish' Limited Edition


Historically, Nivada had never manufactured a blacked-out Depthmaster, much less one on a "beads of rice" metal bracelet. But somehow, as we discussed what a potential Nivada \times Revolution \otimes The Rake collaboration should look like, a specific image kept taking shape in our minds. A lot of this has to do with Laidet's and his affection for all things late '60s and '70s, the first generation of blacked-out watches to emerge from this era which, in the context of the time, were mind-blowingly avant-gardist.



Says Laidet, "I remember talking to you about our favorite watches from the era, and you mentioned two timepieces — the 1972 Porsche Design Chronograph made in collaboration with Orfina and the 1974 TAG Heuer 'Dark Lord.'" These two watches were, of course, on my mind because they had both been revived this year. The Porsche Design watch was recreated to beautiful results with the Chronograph 1 to celebrate the model's 50th anniversary. At the same time during the 2022 Monaco Grand Prix, TAG Heuer unveiled its stunning new "Dark Lord." In the context of the early '70s, the idea of black coating on a watch, even a purposebuilt tool chronograph, was wildly futuristic. Yet both of these brands, fueled by the inventive minds and unrelenting creativity of Ferdinand Alexander "Butzi" Porsche and Jack Heuer respectively, arrived at the same result. Of course, the coatings available at the time didn't have the resilience of the black treatments today, resulting in vintage Porsche Chronographs and Heuer Dark Lords accruing considerable patina over time. But they are, nonetheless, incredibly cool.






Laidet continues, "We started discussing what if we were working at the Nivada R&D department in the '70s and saw these watches. You said we would want to create a blacked-out Chronomaster 'Orange Boy', and I started laughing. I said I need to show you something I am working on..." With that, Laidet reached into the recesses of his phone's photo albums and extracted the image of a blacked-out Depthmaster. Now, the Depthmaster has always been one of my favorite dive watches. It was Nivada's second dive watch, the first being the famous Depthomatic of 1964, the very first timepiece with a built-in depth gauge using a Bourdontube type device. Water would enter the watch, and the pressure would deform the tube, translating into a reading for your depth. But a year later, in 1965, Nivada launched a watch that, in the context of its era, was radical.




As an amusing detail, we added a "No Barracuda" engraving to the caseback as homage to "No Radiation" symbols found on military dive watches like the famous Tornek-Rayville. And accordingly, we decided to name our unique "70s inspired, blacked-out, 1,000-meter water-resistant dive watch, the Depthmaster "No Barracuda."



Laidet and I both needed refreshment and decided to visit the Irish pub that was a stone's throw from my residence in Geneva's Old Town. Once suitably ensconced, we both ordered pints of Guinness, which were pulled to two-stage perfection there, meaning that the beer was poured at a perfect 45-degree angle to three quarters full, rested for 120 seconds, and then filled straight on until the creamy head was just proud of the rim. As we clinked pint glasses, we both stopped mid-toast. We looked at the glasses in our hands and realized that beer colors perfectly represented the ideal two colors of the watch: black for the case, dial and bracelet and Guinness cream for the markers. It was an Archimedes recognizing his bathwater rising and understanding the nature of volumetric displacement "Eureka" moment for the both of us, and it caused us to laugh.







The versatility of Nivada Grenchen





Skindiver watches are stylish and functional timepieces with water resistance suitable for everyday activities and recreational diving. On the other hand, professional diver's watches are purpose-built tools for serious divers, offering higher water resistance, additional features, and certifications to ensure their performance under more challenging underwater circumstances. During the post Ww2 era, outdoor sports, especially diving, became famous, and many known and lesser-known watch brands started manufacturing skin diver watches. No venerable brand would have its catalog complete without one. Nivada had already had a feather in their cap. Their Antarctic model was the first watch that went to the Antarctic. To fulfill the demands of the current fad of water sport, they released the Antarctic Diver in the mid-60s. This watch was an instant hit since Nivada had already proven it's worth. It was no ordinary skin diver. It was an amalgamation of the Antarctic's robustness with Skindiver features. Since the mid-50s, deep-sea diving and underwater explorations have become integral to scientific study and underwater resource tapping. A handful of brands released professional diver's watches. Rolex Sea Dweller, Doxa Sub, Blancpain Fifty Fathoms, and Panerai, to name a few. The crucial point is that none of the above made skin divers! But to keep with the current trend, Nivada released it's Depthmaster in 1965, a professional divers watch. Thus, it became the only watch brand to make skin diver, and professional diver watches. Such was the versatility of the brand. And this trait carries on even today.

Nivada Depthmaster & Nivada Taravana An uncanny connection



In the late 70s and early 80s, the signature case design of the Depthmaster had to be tweaked as per the trend of retrograde the era. This time frame saw watch companies releasing colorful dialed watches with larger cases of various types that screamed on the wrist. The word 'Depthmaster' was synonymous with professional diving and earned its respect in the diving watch world. Discontinuing the series would be detrimental. So Nivada cleverly transitioned the nomenclature onto a few trendy Taravana diver's series models. Hence, you will find similar Nivada with either Taravana, Depthmaster, or both printed on the dial. Quartz movements also powered some. One of the main advantages of this was that most of these Taravanas (also named Depthmasters) had MRP diver's cases. Here are a few great examples.

Interview of Guillaume Laidet - CEO of Nivada Grenchen



How did you first get into watches? Were you always a watch fan or did an event or circumstance steer you into this profession?

When I was around 18, my father started buying old vintage watches to make a small collection. At that time, I had flashed on an Omega Constellation from the 50's that he ended up offering me for my business school degree because I wore it all the time.

At what stage did you decide to revive Nivada?

In March 2019, in Paris during a discussion with Remi Chabrat, who I knew was in contact with the owner of Nivada Grenchen brand. I came up with the idea to relaunch the models and stick to the roots of the vintage collections of the brand.

You and your team have catapulted Nivada to a new high. May you emphasize on the success story?

We have been pleased with the first relaunch of the Chronomaster and the watch community's warm welcome. So we have also relaunched the Antarctic and Depthmaster collection with the same success. Now, we are developing the wholesale presence of Nivada to enable more people to discover the brand worldwide.

What are your future plans for Nivada?

We have so many collections to redo, and every day a collector gives us a new idea of re-edition as the past collection patrimony of Nivada Grenchen is infinitely deep and rich. So our challenge is to carefully choose the one we will relaunch and do it perfectly, always with the idea of offering excellent quality for the best prices possible.
